An emu is a large Australian bird that cannot fly. It is about two metres tall and has a long, thin neck and light brown feathers. The emu has strong, powerful legs, so it can run very fast.

Emus eat flowers, seeds, lizards and large insects — especially caterpillars.

The female lays between seven and twenty eggs in a nest on the ground. The chicks are brown and white when they hatch, so they are well hidden in the grass. Emus can live for up to twenty years.

- Any topping you choose


Method
