SCHOOL COMMENCES ON MONDAY 1st FEBRUARY 2016

Kindergarten

In 2015, all kindergarten students at Merriwa Primary School are offered 30 instructional hours each fortnight.

Sessions begin at 8:30 am and finish at 2:40 pm.

Three classes will be formed operating on a fortnightly roster.

Group A: Week 1 Monday, Tuesday and Thursday

Week 2 Tuesday, and Thursday

Group B: Week 1 Wednesday and Friday

Week 2 Monday, Wednesday and Friday

Group C: Week 1 Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday

Week 2 Monday and Tueday

Pre-Primary

A full five-day programme will operate from day one of the school year at Merriwa Primary School. Parents are reminded that attendance is now compulsory in Pre-Primary.



Your child will need to bring a water bottle, a school hat, spare clothes, recess (snack) and lunch everyday.



The booklist items are shared so please bring them in during the first week and hand them to the classroom teacher.



HAND OVER ARRANGEMENTS

It is expected that you will drop off and collect your child from the classroom each session.


For security reasons you must inform the school office or classroom teacher should anyone other than a parent be collecting the child from the class.

SCHOOL HAT POLICY

Our school has adopted the "No Hat - No Play" policy. This means that for all outdoor activities, sport and physical education periods, our children can only participate when they are wearing a broad brimmed school hat.





COLLECTING STUDENTS DURING SCHOOL HOURS

All parents collecting students from school during school hours are required to visit the school office and sign the children out of school. Parents will then be given a pass so teachers will be aware that the appropriate paperwork has been completed.

DEVELOPMENTAL LEARNING

At Merriwa Primary School we use a developmental learning approach in our classrooms. Your child will be exposed to a variety of learning opportunities that will allow them to develop at their own rate, building from what they already know and can do. We teach phonemic awareness and phonics explicitly at Merriwa.







THE ROLE OF PARENTS AND FAMILIES

Parents and families are a key element of the educational partnership at Merriwa Primary School and as such have a vital role to play.

You are your child's first teacher. You are encouraged to take an active role in the classroom and in our school.

Parents are welcome to view work samples displayed in classrooms. We will keep you informed of your child's progress and you are encouraged to make contact with your child's teacher if you have any concerns.

The early years of your child's life are when the foundations are laid for all future development and learning. Children learn by playing, watching, listening asking, doing and trying new things.

SOME HOME ACTIVITIES

Read to your child every day (reading the same book helps your child to remember the storyline).



Sort things by size colour and shape for example, blocks, food packaging and pegs.

Being active

Play dough can increase hand strength and gives many opportunities for language development.



Counting games and talking about numbers helps with maths.

PARENT ROSTER


The parent roster enables you be more involved in your child's education and to spend special time with your child.

Sometimes children come to school when they are unwell or become unwell during the school day. Teachers who are concerned as to the general well being of a student will confer with the school administration then contact the parents to arrange for that child to go home.

Please advise your teacher of any medical conditions such as asthma or severe allergies that may require a health plan.
