Dear Year 3 and 5 Students,

This week you have been sitting the NAPLAN tests. Year 4 and 6 children have practiced the tests with you. As you take these tests there is something very important for you to know. These tests do not assess all of what makes each of you unique.



The teachers who score these tests do not know that you are proud of our school and that you do your best to uphold our expectations of being friendly, positive and respectful and that you achieve.

They have not seen the way that you represent our school at important events and can speak confidently to a large group.

They have not seen the way that some of you can dance with grace or draw or shine on the sports field.

They do not know that your friends count on you to be there for them when they are sad.

They do not know that some of you help your family and look after your little brothers and sisters or cousins. They do not know that you are caring, thoughtful and that every day you do your best.

It is hard to test all these attributes.

The scores you get from these tests will tell you how you did on that day and what you need to do to improve.

But they do not tell you everything. They don't tell you that you brighten up your teachers' day. They don't tell you about the things that make you special.

So come to school this week ready to do your best on the NAPLAN tests. Make sure you get to bed on time, have breakfast and lots of healthy fruit for crunch and sip. Make sure you have some fun at recess and lunchtime with your friends. Come to school every day.

Remember there is no one way to test all the wonderful things that make you, YOU!

Room 19 has been learning about area and perimeter in Maths. We talked about area being the amount of space INSIDE a flat shape and perimeter is the distance around the OUTSIDE of a shape. We measured the area and perimeter of our classroom using metre rulers. Our classroom's area is 72 metres squared and the perimeter is 34 metres. We used trundle wheels to measure the basketball court. The area of the basketball court is 450 metres squared and the perimeter is 90 metres.
