A new project developed by ECU aims to encourage Indigenous students in Western Australian high schools to study science at a tertiary level. We are proud to be part of this partnership with ECU, which brings forensic science to life through modern scientific and traditional Aboriginal techniques. The Year 6 / 7 Classes have attended the workshops, and the Year 4 students will be taking part later in the year.

The project, *Old Ways New Ways*, brings together Western and Indigenous knowledge perspectives to science. It has been developed by Dr Magdalena Wajrak from the School of Natural Sciences and ECU's Cultural Awareness Officer Jason Barrow and is supported by ECU's engagement team.
