## OVAL UPGRADE

NOTIFICATION OF CONSTRUCTION - OVAL EXTENSION AND FLOODLIGHTING AT ADDISON PARK - MERRIWA The City of Wanneroo, as part of its approved Capital Works Program, is proceeding with the construction of an oval extension and floodlighting at Addison Park in Merriwa. The works will comprise:

\* Construction of Oval Extension to the South West of the AFL oval – March to June 2019. These are the main works.

\* Construction of floodlighting and poles for the newly extended AFL oval – June to November 2019. These are minor works. Works are scheduled to commence on 15th March 2019 with completion in November 2019 pending weather constraints. During construction:

\* Temporary fencing may be in place to direct the public around the worksite and will remain in place for the duration of the works.

\* The works will be conducted from 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

\* Whilst we are seeking to minimise imposition, construction will require some bays of the West carpark. These will be fenced for safety.

\*A portion of the oval will always be available for school and public use.

Whilst it is inevitable that works of this nature will cause some inconvenience, every endeavour will be made to ensure that this is kept to a minimum. The City considers that this project will be of significant benefit to Merriwa Primary School and the local community;
