
Year 4/5 Room 22

These incredible places cover only 2% of the Earth's surface but yet contain more than half of the world's animal and plant species. Rainforests are often called the lungs of the planet for their role in absorbing carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas, and producing oxygen, upon which all animals depend for survival. 

All year 3 and 5 students will be taking part in this year's NAPLAN between the 14th and 24th May. Again our students will complete the test on-line, except for the Year 3 writing. Parents are able to view the demonstration site to view the practice tests that can be completed with your children. Teachers will be thoroughly preparing all children to assess the site and complete the tests to the best of their ability prior to the tests. The web address for the platform is:
