
Fairy Tale Times Farmer Grows An Enormous Turnip!

"Someone's been sleeping in my bed too," said Mummy Bear.


"Someone's been sleeping in my bed, and she's still there!" cried Baby Bear.

"Oh Granny, what big teeth you have," gasped Little Red Riding Hood.


"All the better to eat you with!" replied the wolf.

A dice

A counter per player

How to play...

- Players take it in turns to roll the dice. The player with the highest rolled number goes first, the person with the second highest rolled number goes second and so on.
- 2. The player moves the counter the number of spaces shown on the dice, then partitions the number into hundreds, tens and ones. If they correctly partition the number, e.g. 583, 5 hundreds, 8 tens and 3 ones, they stay on the square. If not, they move back to the previous square that they came from.
- 3. If a player lands on a snake's head, the player's counter slides down to the square at the bottom of the snake's tail.
- 4. If a player lands on the bottom of a ladder, the player's counter climbs up to the square at the top of the ladder.
- 5. The first player to reach 30 is the winner!




SIMPLE MAGILLES

Lever A lever is a beam balanced at a fixed point that can help lift heavy weight with less effort.	Wheel and Axle A wheel and axle is made up of two circles. The force applied to the wheel multiplies when it transfers to the axle.
Pulley A pulley is made up of a belt or rope wrapped around a wheel. It can be used to lift loads and change direction of a force.	Inclined Plane An inclined plane is a flat surface that is tilted, with one end higher than the other. It is used to raise and lower heavy loads.
Screw A screw twists into surfaces easily, but is tough to remove. It is used to amplify (increase) a force or hold two objects together.	Wedge A wedge is a triangular prism-shaped tool used to separate two objects, split an object or hold an object in place.

Ingredients


- 3 English muffins (split)
- 6 tbsp. pizza sauce
- 4 slices ham (diced)
- 1 tin crushed pineapple (well drained)
- 3 cups pizza cheese
- · Any topping you choose


Method

- 1. Toast the muffins in the toaster and spread 1 tablespoon of pizza sauce on each.
- 2. Scatter ham and pineapple (or topping of choice) on the pizza sauce.
- 3. Top with pizza cheese.
- 4. Place under the grill until the cheese is melted and serve.

Notes

• You can do these in the oven for 10 minutes at 160C fan-forced to melt the cheese.
